Executive summary

At its September 2024 workshop OLC Board considered proposals for LeO's 2025/26 budget, together with draft business plan activities under each of its strategic objectives. In light of feedback received, LeO has refined and developed its proposals into:

- A formal submission to the Legal Services Board, in line with the LSB's defined Budget Acceptance Criteria. For 2025/26 the LSB has included a new criterion relating to LeO's work under the strategic impact objective, the effectiveness of this work, and progress toward enhanced transparency of its ombudsman decisions.
- Based on this submission, a draft document for public consultation. This includes, as previously agreed with Board, beginning consultation on enhancing the transparency of ombudsman decisions.

Board is now asked to review and approve both documents, which will be shared with the LSB in advance of its November 2024 Board meeting.

Consultation is due to open on 31 October and will close on 13 December 2024. OLC Board will receive a summary of feedback early in the new year.

The documents will be shared with LSB in final form in February 2025, with the final business plan and budget (subject to approval) published at the start of the new financial year.

- Feed back on the LSB submission and consultation and approve them for issue to the LSB and publication respectively, subject to updates reflecting any feedback.
- If necessary, to approve the delegation of authority to the Chair for final approval of post-feedback documents
